Patti Carey of Patti's Patchwork <u>www.pattispatchwork.com</u>



Patti Carey is a prominent figure in the quilting world and has made significant contributions to the industry especially through her association with **Northcott Fabrics** where she serves as the Vice-President – Public Relations. She headed up the marketing/sample department from 1986 to 2012. This included co-ordinating Northcott's pattern program to support their new fabric collections, as well as liaising with various quilting magazines, book publishers and quilt designers to provide current and inspiring content.

Patti is the creative force behind **Patti's Patchwork**. Her quilt patterns are known for their efficient and time saving methods. She is the inventor of the **E-Z Miter/Lone Star tool**, which simplifies sewing perfect mitered corners and lone stars. She has

also published a book entitled "A Taste of Napa Valley". She was a regular contributor to The Quilter magazine and continues to contribute to the Fons & Porter group of publications. She has had projects published in several quilting magazines and recently designed her first fabric collection, Vino, for Banyan Batiks, a division of Northcott. Her patterns include a variety of designs, from scenic panels framed with chevron borders to medallions showcased in octagonal blocks.

Patti's passion for quilting, innovative tools and collaboration with Northcott Fabrics have left a lasting impact on the quilting community.

Currently she travels to quilt guilds and shops to inspire and educate quilters with interesting and entertaining presentations on how fabric is designed, and how to use it to its best advantage. Her comprehensive line of quilt patterns utilizing efficient and time-saving techniques are available through her website at www.pattispatchwork.com.

Quilting Terminology...from Anne Balanyk

Rotary Rulers: Rulers made from Plexiglas type material. They have a raised edge to guide rotary cutters along the edge.

Running Stitch: A style of stitch where the needle goes in and out of fabric in a continual motion.

Sashing: Strips of fabric sewn around or between blocks of a quilt top. These strips are generally joined together by cornerstone blocks or sashing squares. (See Lattice)

Sashing Squares: Squares used to sew sashing together. (See Cornerstones)

Scrap Quilts: Quilts that are made from various fabrics, often scraps from other projects or clothing. There are many patterns for this style of quilt, or you can just start sewing them together and cut them into blocks.

Scrim: A term used in batting where a thin layer of polyester is added to the cotton to be needle punched into, this gives stability to your batting so it won't break apart within your quilt. Scrim adds poly to your batting so it will no longer be 100% cotton.

Seam: The line where two pieces of fabric are joined together by sewing them with thread.

Seam Allowance: The fabric between the sewing line and the raw edge. In quilting it is ¼ inch.

Seam Ripper: A tool used for picking or ripping out sewing stitches.

Selvage: Manufactured finished edge of fabric that prevents fraying before it gets to consumer. This is where you can find the name of the fabric line, company and colors that went into the fabric.

Serging: A method of looped threads over the raw edge of the fabric to finish the edge to prevent fraying. This is a fun way to finish wall hangings.

Setting the Seam: When an iron is set on the seam before pressing it to the side or open depending on your project. Allows the thread to relax into your fabric and become more secure.

Setting: Arrangement of blocks and various fabrics in a quilt. A straight setting is when blocks are placed in vertical and horizontal grid like design. Diagonal is when a block is set on point, resembling a diamond.

Sharps: Sets of extra sharp sewing needles for hand piecing or applique. Many sewers use these for bindings as well.








Membership...Margaret Newey
