You may have missed my first Block of the Month which ran last year. It was very popular amongst the participants and I just couldn't stop making blocks! I've created a new Block of the Month program for quilt guilds and I'd like to invite you to join me on this scrappy adventure! Anyone who has seen this quilt has fallen in love with it - your guild will too!

Those of you who know me, may have heard my presentation "Confessions of a Scrapaholic" or maybe you've attended a workshop with me and know that I LOVE scrappy quilts. Here is a chance for your guild to participate in my latest scrappy adventure.

Scrappy quilts are in vogue again, thanks to designers like Jen Kingwell, Bonnie Hunter, Sarah Fielke, etc. I have always made scrappy quilts, and love to encourage quilters to dig into their stash before a trip to the quilt store. One of the many things participants loved about my program was that it could be made from the stash you already have.

This is a 6-month program that works!

I provide detailed instructions and include a short zoom talk to introduce the Block of the Month to your guild or I provide a zoom talk that can be scheduled with the participants a few months into the project to give guidance, answer questions and share progress to date.

Your guild will provide one experienced quilter who will act as a coordinator. The coordinator will work ahead of the group and be responsible for sending the monthly instructions to the participants. She will answer questions and follow up with me if they encounter an issue they cannot resolve.

Laurie Mascarin will be acting as coordinator of the BOM program for the Halton Hills Quilters' Guild.

- ➤ We plan to start the 6-part program in September 2023. The monthly instructions will be sent to the participants on the guild meeting day by email.
- ➤ The cost will depend on the number of participants, e.g., if there are 10 people in the group, each participant will pay \$30; 15 people pay \$20 each.



















