There are some great pictures on my blog - you might want to take a look. It's <u>www.pattispatchwork.com</u> We have finalized all of the paperwork for the shipment of 6 skids of quilts weighing 2700lbs, and they are leaving our warehouse on June 1 to arrive at Patchwork Quilting Tsuchin on June 24. We are so grateful for the support of Canadian quilters . I had high hopes that we could collect 1000 quilts, so I am over the moon with our final total."	Hi everyone Next year we hope to change things up just a lit- tle. Instead of doing a tinners' exchange we were thinking of doing a postcard exchange. Thanks for the idea Judy. I will be organizing things. If we can get enough people here's how it would work. If you sign up you are agreeing to make one postcard for each person on the list size 4 by 6 inches. They can all be the same or different. They can be stitched, painted, steam-a-seamed, traditional, fiber art, or even one piece of fabric. You can back them in cardboard or fabric. It's your choice. All that I insist on is that they be stitched around the outside edge of the card to fin- ish them off.


