It would be appreciated if you are interested in doing this job that you let Judy Makinson know before the September guild meeting.



Postcards

Hi everyone!

This year instead of doing a tinners' exchange the guild is going to try a postcard exchange. Here's how it will work.

Each person will agree to make one postcard for every other person on the list. For example, if 15 people sign up you will be making 14 cards.

These can be done in any style - pieced, appliqué, stamped, painted, fiber art, beaded, etc... whatever strikes your fancy. They can all be the same or all different. It's up to you.

The cards must be 4 by 6 inches finished. You can back them any way you like. I use Bristol board from the dollar store.

The cards must have a finished edge of some kind. Straight stitch, satin, blanket, etc...

You can mail them or give them out at the meetings. Everyone must have all their cards done and given out by the June 2012 meeting.

This is a great chance to try out a new technique on a small scale and it's lots of fun to get something in the mail besides a bill or another pizza flyer for once. The sign up sheet will be available at the September meeting. We still need a few more people. Please contact me if you wish to sign up or if you have any questions.



Tea Room


The Tea Room at our Quilt Show will be serving sandwiches, dessert squares and tea/coffee/bottled water.
