We held two Outreach days this year at Trinity United Church in Acton. A third was cancelled because of double bookings at the church.

I had the pleasure of delivering over 100 quilts to the following organizations and people.

Community Living, Acton - 3 different homes received 25 quilts

Fire victims in Rockwood – 5 quilts to the family

Several quilts were given to friends of guild members at members' requests for a variety of illnesses.

Extendacare in Georgetown received 25 quilts for the social worker to hand out as she sees fit.

Trinity United Church, our host church, received 12 quilts this year for the minister to give to his parishioners. This has become a very important part of our association with the church.

Links to Care received 25 guilts and several placemats again this year.

The Bruce Trail received a quilt to raffle.

Cash – Cancer Assistive Services Halton received a raffle quilt.
