Hello, I have 4 wooden stands for traditional quilting frame. I don't use them anymore and would love to pass them to someone to enjoy for free. I live close to Acton.








Library Report - Jane Symmes

Appliqué books to help you with the Mystery Quilt project:

- > A05 Appliqué Techniques Made Easy (Annie's Quilting)
- D20 The modern appliqué workbook: easy invisible zigzag method - 11 quilts to round out your skills
- > F19 Art of Hand Appliqué: Precision Techniques for Stitching and Pattern Drafting
- P15 Appliqué the Basics and Beyond: The Complete Guide to Successful Machine and Hand Techniques with Dozens of Designs to Mix and Match



Quilting tip from Jane:

I will be taking a day-long workshop (Oct 28 or Nov 2 at Country Concessions in Cookstown) on machine stitching a giant Dahlia Panel.

I decided I needed to bone up on using my walking foot and was reading *WALK: Master Machine Quilting with your Walking Foot* by Jacquie Gering (shelf number 607) and found this useful (brilliant) tip for those of us who have a "computerized" machine:

- Set your straight stitch for whatever length you need for quilting
- Set your zig-zag stitch at 0 width & 0.2 stitch length
- · When stopping and starting lines of quilting:
 - Switch from your straight stitch to the zigzag and sew 3-4 stitches in place
 - Then switch back to the straight stitch without having to reset any settings!!


