Those were the days when one laboured with regular scissors, regular rulers, and cardboard templates. The piece measured 127" \times 103". In the end, her mother thought she ought to keep it.

So she went out and bought a very expensive gift to take to the wedding. That quilt, horribly made, still sits in the closet in pristine condition.

Nowadays, Dorothy likes to create one-of-a-kind art quilts, whether traditional or pictorial, to express beauty in art and nature. Like many quilters, Dorothy started out with machine piecing and hand quilting, but soon switched to doing all her work with the domestic sewing machine. She enjoys the entire process of quiltmaking, from designing to quilting, but the best part for her is the binding because it means she finished the work. She hopes her artwork would inspire people to think 'outside the box' and try new quilting adventures.

Besides quilting, Dorothy is also an avid gardener and photographer.




6 Tips For Fabric Choices

- #1 Start with a Focal Fabric and choose other fabrics to go with it
- #2 Pick at least one medium print and several smaller prints
- #3 Choose 3 4 low volume fabrics that are lighter
- #4 Find at least 3 fabrics that are batiks or tonals in different colours to go with the focal fabric
- #5 Pick fabrics with different values and hues within your colour palette
- #6 Choose a curated fabric bundle with all of these fabrics already chosen!
