Hi Everyone,



BLOCK OF THE MONTH

CHOP SUEY

"Chop Suey" designed by Scott Flanagan. Pattern appears in Quiltmaker May/June 2015. www.quiltmaker.com

Finished Block: 12 ½ inch (with outer seam allowances)

Background: Beige Batik


Square and fencing: Medium or dark green batik


From beige batik: cut 2 rectangles $2^{1/2}$ " x $5^{1/2}$ " (B), 4 rectangles $2^{1/2}$ " x 9" (C) & one $2^{1/2}$ " square (E)

From green batik: cut one 5" sq. (A); 1 rectangle 2 1/2" x 9" (C), 1 rectangle 2 1/2" x 13" (D) & one 2 1/2 " sq. (E)

Sew pieces together as shown:

Use scant 1/4 inch seams. Press seams toward dark fabric.







Press and trim block to $12 \frac{1}{2}$ square.

9 1/2 " square for background Size:


Blue (light, medium or dark) Background fabric:


Neutrals Owl Body:

Eyes, beak and tree branch: See images & pattern.


Optional elements: wings, feet, hat, stars, moon, leaves, embellishments, etc.

Directions: Add elements including embellishments as desired. Use your preferred method of applique. Use stitching of your choice to attach the applique pieces – straight, blanket, zig zag, etc.
